Building Hope for Homeownership One Family at a Time

When you Google "Hope," the first definition that pops up is, "A feeling or desire for a certain thing to happen." For many families across Dane County the dream of owning a home is so far out of reach, they can't even imagine. It's just an abstract dream.

Like so many Habitat families, including Hassan and Maryam's, all hope for homeownership was gone.

In 2009, Hassan suffered a heart attack and didn't have health insurance. His treatment left him \$80,000 in medical debt and his family faced financial ruin. "We were hopeless, basically," Hassan said, "All our dreams of owning a home were shot down."

Hassan heard about Habitat for Humanity and learned that if his family put in the 375 hours of hard work and effort, homeownership could become a reality. "Habitat gave me hope," Hassan said, "It was definitely a life changing moment."





This fall at Habitat, we had the pleasure of celebrating our 250th home built in Dane County. But, as you may know, that's not just homes built; that's 250 families, like Hassan and Maryam's, across 18 different communities, to whom we've spread hope and made dreams come true.

At Habitat for Humanity, our mission is to create long-lasting, affordable housing solutions for working families who've faced difficult circumstances. Although hope isn't our first goal, it's something we hear over and over again from Habitat homeowners.

"With the help of Habitat, we have a place that we can call home; a place that the kids can call home." Hassan told me, "I honestly cannot see where we would have been if Habitat said no."

On behalf of Habitat and all of our partner families, thank you for creating hope in our communities. We are so grateful for your support as we build homes and spread hope across Dane County.


